A little bit about our historic Greeley Building

Built in 1833, you're dining in the oldest brick building in Nashua.

1834: Greeley houses a temporary First Congregational Church.

1842: Greeley serves as City Hall until 1853. During this time many votes took place here, including the vote to split Nashua into two distinct cities.

1901: The Nashua Telegraph reports on the auction which saw the building sell for \$52.50 on condition that it was moved off of Main Street. Via horse and chain, it was lifted and moved across the street where it stands today.

1931-1959: J Howard Giles introduces the building as The Tavern restaurant and hotel. The Tavern becomes one of the best known dining areas around and is frequented by wealthy shop owners and politicians.

1959-2002

Through the next few decades The Tavern Hotel catered to a more rambunctious crowd even housing a notorious brothel. While we're sure the spirit was lively The Tavern was slowly demoralized into closing all doors in 2002.
